Cruel prank leaves underprivileged kids in tears at hotel doorstep

JOHOR BARU: A joyous trip for 75
underprivileged children from
Selangor to a complimentary
buka puasa feast and a night's
stay at a hotel here turned sour
when they found out that no
such invitation was made.

When they arrived at the hotel,
the children were reduced to
tears while their eight caretakers were left shocked when they
were told by front office employees that no such invitation was
extended by the hotel.

The children, between two
and 18, and their caretakers
came all the way from the Surau
Silaturrahim home in Gombak
and arrived at the Berjaya

Waterfront Hotel in two buses on Wednesday.
Surau Silaturrahim caretaker Normala Baharim, 27, said a man named Faiz had called her and introduced himself as an assistant to the hotel's public relations department.
"When he made the offer, we were happy because the children could have a fun trip and a stay at the hotel. He also promised to reimburse our travel expenses," she said yesterday.
"When we arrived at the hotel, we called Faiz, but his phone could not be reached at all.
"I am shocked over this prank and I feel bad for the kids because they were so excited during the journey," she said, adding that a

police report has been lodged.
Berjaya Waterfront Hotel
marketing and communications
senior manager Elaina Tan confirmed that no such employee by
that name worked in the hotel's
public relations department.
"It was sad for all of us at the
hotel to see the kids crying. So,
our general manager decided
to host the group to a free buka
puasa dinner.
"We also arranged to have 30
hotel rooms for them to stay in
for the night. We also provided
them with sahur meals later," she
added.
Johor Baru South OCPD Asst
Comm Sulaiman Salleh said the
case was being investigated
under Section 420 of the Penal
Code for cheating.
